- The classes who will be doing these sessions are:


Primary KS2a - Monday 1

3D Printing and Coding

Year 7 - Printing and Coding

In 3D printing & Coding Enrichment we will be exploring the emerging technology of 3D printers and nuances of block coding. There is a lot of design and engineering work that goes into technological devices today, and it's important to not only know the end result, but how to get there. In this class we will both explore all aspects of the 3D printing process to create something you can take home, as well as expanding on your knowledge of block coding to create more advanced game systems.

3D printing:

- Types of 3D printers and how they work.
- Types of materials 3D printers use.
- Why 3D prints need supports and why can they fail so easily.
- Settings of a 3D printer and what they mean.

Coding

- Modifying variables and components of an object.
- Instances of objects and how they are labelled and referenced.
- Passing and tracking information between blocks.
- Drawing pixels to a screen and using screen space.

Benana Music

Year 9 - Benana Music, Pure Music Studio


All year 9 pupils will take part in one term at Benana music. Ben and Ana have a music studio in Southampton that have 5 different recording studios. Each room has different equipment as such:

- Room 1: Instruments: 2 drum kits (1 acoustic/1 electric) & bass guitar
- Room 2: Instruments: 2 Keyboards
- Room 3: Instruments: 2 electric guitars & 1 acoustic guitar
- Room 4: Instruments: 2 microphones
- Room 5: Production suite

How it may look each term:

- Weeks 1-3: learning how to play instruments/sing/song write (teaching you how to play/sing their favorite songs)
- Weeks 4-7: creating/writing your own music/songs
- Weeks 8-10: recording your songs
- Week 11: practicing performing your songs
- Week 12: end of term performances.

You will get a certificate of achievement from Benana at the end of the term.



Construction and Robotics

You will be building cool models using Meccano, K'NEX, LEGO, and Wooden Puzzles. Get ready to use your hands and imagination to create fun and exciting things with these awesome building sets!

The Nest pupils

If you are part of the nest, you will do enrichment every week, but your enrichment will alternate between two different activities

You will be doing cooking on site one week and animal care at Manor Farm, offsite, on the following week.

Your timetable will look like this:

Monday 15th September – Cooking

Monday 22nd September – Animal Care

Monday 29th September – Cooking

Monday 6th October – Animal Care

Monday 13th October – Cooking

This cycle will continue throughout the year.

You will also have the chance to learn Makaton or do sing and sign.



10B + 10C 11B + 11C

10B + C and 11.1 + 11.2, you will <u>NOT</u> have enrichment every week.

Year 10 – you will have enrichment every 3rd week throughout the year. This will mean you will get 11 double enrichment sessions throughout the year. Both 10B and 10C will go out on the same day to the same activity.

Year 11 –You will only have enrichment during Autumn term. You will each have four enrichment sessions which will be fun activities offsite.
